Decatur Chapter #4 Sponsors USCS Regional Spring Coverfest


We are hosting a USCS Regional Spring Coverfest at PNSE.

Date: April 5, 6, and 7th.


Location: Philadelphia National Stamp Exhibition in Oaks, PA at the Expo Center.

USS Guardian MCM-5 Grounding Investigation To Include Faulty Chart Data

USS Guardian in better times PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii - A U.S. Navy investigation to assess the circumstances surrounding the USS Guardian (MCM 5) grounding occurred in Philippine waters will include information on faulty digital navigation chart data that misplaced the location Tubbataha Reef. On Friday, the U.S. National Geospatial-(NGA) Intelligence Agency provided the Navy preliminary findings of a review on Digital Nautical Charts (DNC) that contain inaccurate navigation data and may have been a factor in the Guardian grounding that

occurred in the Sulu Sea on Jan. 17 Philippine time. NGA has reviewed data from more than 150,000 square nautical miles in the surrounding area and found no additional errors. Since DNC is used for navigation by Guardian other U.S. Navy ships, Navigator of the Navy Rear Adm. Jonathan on White Friday released precautionary guidance to Fleet and ship commanders. White's message states, "initial review of navigation indicates an error in the location of Tubbataha Reef" on the digital "While the erroneous navigation chart data important information, no one should jump to conclusions," said U.S. Pacific Fleet spokesman Capt. Darryn James. U.S. 7th Fleet ships are on scene along with several support vessels to conduct salvage operations that minimize environmental effects to the reef.



Guardian dismantling underway in March Bloggers contend:

Some bloggers have posted opinions that officials of the national parks system of the Philippines Government radioed the USS Guardian MCM-5 to change course to avoid the reef. The bloggers contend that the Captain of the vessel, LCDR Mark Rice ignored the warning and was heading to a location near the reef so crew members could enjoy R&R on the reef.
