Israel's Deadliest Submarines Are Nearly Ready

Israel's new Dolphin II-class submarines are the largest undersea craft built in Germany since the Second World War, and when they reach active service they're expected to take their place among the world's most effective subs.



TANIN underway

Three submarines are in various construction stages of ThyssenKrupp Marine Systems in Kiel, Germany - the TANIN, RAHAV, and a yet-to-be-named third ship. The submarines are bigger than the three Israeli Navy Type 800 Dolphin-class submarines built in the 1990s: 68.6 meters long versus 57.3 meters for the older subs; 2,050 tons' displacement on the surface, 2,400 tons submerged versus 1,565 tons and 1,720

USS CONSTELLATION (Sloopof-War) heading for repairs at U S Coast Guard Yard

The USS Constellation, a historic sloop-of-war that dates to 1864 will undergo a \$2.25 mil renovation at the U S Coast Guard Yard in Curtis Bay, MD. The repairs are necessary due

to severe rot found behind the sloop's laminated hull planking which was added between 1996 and 1999 during a \$9 mil overhaul at Sparrows Point Shipyard in Baltimore. The damage was discovered in 2011 and the funds are almost in place to begin the repairs.

The vessel has to be out of the water to make the needed repairs according to a museum spokesmen. Commissioned in 1855, the Constellation was the flagship of the U.S. African Squadron and helped to capture vessels engaging in illegal slave In the 1870s. trade. Constellation became a training ship at the Naval Academy, and it later served as the flagship of the U.S. Atlantic fleet for about six months during World War II.
